# A BILL

  - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
  - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

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## 1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2 This Act may be cited as the "Strategic Response to3 Asian Carp Invasion Act".

#### 4 SEC. 2. FINDINGS.

- 5 Congress finds the following:
- 6 (1) The rapid spread of several invasive species 7 of Asian Carp in the Upper Mississippi River and 8 Ohio River basins and tributaries threatens eco-9 systems and billions of dollars of economic activities 10 connected to outdoor recreation in States throughout 11 the Midwest.
- (2) While Federal efforts have focused on preventing the spread of Asian Carp into the Great
  Lakes, there is growing recognition of the threat
  these invasive species pose to other ecosystems in
  the Upper Mississippi and Ohio River basins.

# 17 SEC. 3. MULTIAGENCY EFFORT TO SLOW THE SPREAD OF

18 ASIAN CARP IN THE UPPER MISSISSIPPI AND
19 OHIO RIVER BASINS AND TRIBUTARIES.

The Director of the United States Fish and Wildlife Service, in coordination with the Army Corps of Engineers, the National Park Service, and the United States Geological Survey, shall lead a multiagency effort to slow the spread of Asian Carp in the Upper Mississippi and Ohio River basins and tributaries by providing high-level technical assistance, coordination, best practices, and sup3

port to State and local government strategies to slow, and 1 2 eventually eliminate, the threat posed by Asian Carp. To 3 the maximum extent practicable, the multiagency effort 4 shall apply lessons learned and best practices such as 5 those developed under the Management and Control Plan for Bighead, Black, Grass, and Silver Carps in the United 6 7 States, November 2007 and the Asian Carp Control Stra-8 tegic Framework.

## 9 SEC. 4. REPORT TO CONGRESS.

10 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Director of the United States Fish and Wildlife Service shall by December 31 of each 11 year submit to the Subcommittee on Interior, Environ-12 13 ment, and Related Agencies of the Committee on Appropriations and the Committee on Natural Resources of the 14 15 House of Representatives a report on the coordinated strategies established and progress made toward goals to 16 control and eliminate the Asian Carp in the Upper Mis-17 18 sissippi and Ohio River basins and tributaries.

19 (b) CONTENTS.—The Director shall include in each20 report—

(1) observed changes in the range of Asian carp
in such waters during the 2-year period preceding
submission of the report;

24 (2) a summary of Federal agency efforts, in-25 cluding cooperative efforts with non-Federal part-

ners, to control the spread of Asian carp in such
 waters;

3 (3) research needed that could improve the abil4 ity to control such spread;

5 (4) quantitative measures that will be used to6 document progress in controlling such spread; and

7 (5) cross-cut accounting of Federal and non-8 Federal expenditures to control such spread.
